This Deed, made this the 13th day of May, 1905, between George Williams and Lelia Williams, his wife, and Wiliam Young and Mary Lou Young, his wife, parties of the first part, and Gordon Mills, James Anderson, Jack Anderson, John Rollens, John Eaves and Granville Smith Trustees for the Order of Odd Fellows, and John Smith, Henry Vaughan, Preston Mayse, Anderson Harvey, Daniel Hoge and John Simkins, Trustees for the Order of St. Lukes, parties of the second part; Whereas the said parties of the second part are acting are acting as trustees for their respective orders as aforesaid for the purpose of organizing a mutual Society to be known as the Odd Fellows and St. Luke's Union, said trustees having been duly confirmed as such by the Judge of the Circuit Court of Montgomery County, Virginia, Now and therefore this deed witnesseth that the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Ninety-five (\$95.00) Dollars in hand paid by the parties of the second part, receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, conveyed and confirmed, with covenant of general warranty unto the said parties of the second part, and to their successors for the benefit of their respective orders, all that certain piece or parcel of land situated in the west and of the town of Blacksburg, county of Montgomery and State of Virginia, and a part of what is known as the Henry Vaughan Lot, and bounded as follows: BEGINNING at a stake or stone, corner to Henry Vaughan; thence \$ 58° 40 E 45 feet to a stake or stone; thence new line S 24 W 30 feet to a stake or stone; thence N 58 30 W 45 feet to a stake or stone by a street; Thence N 24 E 30 feet to the BEGINNING.
